Cops see through crack in man's hemorrhoid tale

MIDDLETOWN — A city man has been slapped with drug charges after local police found \$80 worth of crack cocalne in his "buttocks area."

prison in December. He reportedly told police he primarily serves as a middleman and sets up meetings between dealers and buyers. Turner told police he only sells small amounts of crack because he is trying to turn his life around, according to the arrest report.

He was charged with possession of crack cocalne, possession of crack cocalne with intentio sell, possession of drugs within 1,500 level of a school zone and possession of drug paraphernalia.

He was set free after posting a \$10,000 non-surety bond and is set to appear in court Friday.
